Planting Recommendations

- Limit planting to late June through October for all plants.
- Sow grass seed in mid June.

- Sow perennial seed in mid June or November.
- Plant Pines and Junipers in 1-2ft berms of well drained soil.
- Plant water loving, leafy plants on the east (leeward) side of windbreaks.
- The soils of Baderville tend to be depleted of nitrogen. Add small amounts of organic compost to backfill when planting.
